Introducing Today's Liturgy

There is an iconic photograph taken shortly after Hurricane Katrina had struck New Orleans ten years ago this summer. The photo shows the devastation of a cemetery in the historic district of the Big Easy – trees have been toppled, debris covers the ground, and several burial vaults are broken open and smashed.

But in the middle of all this devastation, entirely untouched by the storm, stands a statue of the risen Christ, arms extended wide, offering to this scene a benediction of calm amidst all the chaos. Such is the image conveyed in today's gospel – the image of Christ with his arms extended wide over the chaos of our individual lives, over our beloved congregation, and over a world in turmoil, saying, "Peace! Be Still!"

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

¹As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as

servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, ⁷truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.



The peace of Christ be with you always.



Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.
