# **Second Sunday of Advent**

Christ Lutheran 9:00 a.m. + Moxham Lutheran 10:30 a.m. December 7, 2025

The wilderness in which John the Baptist lived is key to understanding Israelite history. The wilderness is more than a geographical place – it is THE PLACE where God meets, reveals to, tests, and saves God's very own people. Salvation always seems to come from the wilderness. Moses, Elijah, and David all had to flee to the wilderness. Likewise, Jesus will emerge from the wilderness to begin his ministry and preach good news to a disconsolate and demoralized people. He will return there several times during his ministry.

It was in the wilderness that God tested the people of the Old Covenant, and it was there that they rebelled. It was in the wilderness that God saved them again and again, and the wilderness was the crucible out of which they were molded into a nation. The wilderness was both a route to the Promised Land and a place of spiritual formation. It was a place where people sinned, repented, and had their relationship with God restored.

Could it be? Could it be that it is in the wilderness of our lives that we meet our Savior and our God? Could it be that in that wilderness our paths, too, will be made straight? Could our sojourn together as a "parish" also be a time in which the mission and ministry of this congregation is likewise being reshaped and reformed?



### **Blessing of the Advent Wreath**

Today is the second Sunday of Advent -

a time to prepare again for the coming of Jesus.

We light a candle to remind us that

Jesus brings light into the dark wilderness places of the world.

Through the prophet Malachi, God promises a messenger who will prepare the way for the coming of the Lord. John the Baptist was that messenger who prepared Jesus' way. Now we wait in faith for Christ's coming again.

We light the second candle to remind us that all of God's promises were fulfilled in the birth of Jesus Christ – The Prince of Peace.

After the second candle is lit we sing vs. 2 of No. 240 as follows

Light two candles to watch for Messiah:
let the light banish darkness.
He shall feed the flock like a shepherd,
gently lead them homeward.

### First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

- <sup>1</sup> A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
- <sup>2</sup> The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
- <sup>3</sup> His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see or decide by what his ears hear,

- <sup>4</sup> but with righteousness he shall judge for the poor and decide with equity for the oppressed of the earth;
- he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.
- <sup>5</sup> Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist and faithfulness the belt around his loins.
- <sup>6</sup> The wolf shall live with the lamb; the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the lion will feed together, and a little child shall lead them.
- <sup>7</sup> The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.
- <sup>8</sup> The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den.

<sup>9</sup> They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

<sup>10</sup> On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.



"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.' "

<sup>4</sup> Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. <sup>5</sup> Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him, <sup>6</sup> and they were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.

<sup>7</sup> But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath?

<sup>8</sup> Therefore, bear fruit worthy of repentance, <sup>9</sup> and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. <sup>10</sup> Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

<sup>11</sup> "I baptize you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. <sup>12</sup> His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."


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
